



Roundwood Park School now offers Sixth Form students the opportunity to participate in Wings of Hope.

In groups of six they must set up a business running various enterprises with 100% of all proceeds going to charity. As part of the project they also get amazing opportunities to attend either work experience placements or talks given by top companies such as Saatchi & Saatchi.

Wings of Hope currently funds and supports several educational projects across the developing world and in the UK: They support an existing school in India and will soon be opening a second school, which will be entirely funded and run by the Wings of Hope.

The Wings of Hope Achievement Award – or WOHAAs as it is now fondly called – is a social enterprise award scheme for 14 – 18 year olds. The ethos of the award is the 3 Rs:

- **Recognising the exceptional fundraising efforts of students in the UK**
- **Ripening key transferable skills, in communication, teamwork and enterprise**
- **Rewarding such efforts with some fantastic prizes and experiences**

The Wings of Hope also provides opportunities for UK students through its Achievement Award: while raising funds for the projects in India and Malawi, UK students will enhance their entrepreneurial skills and learn about social responsibility, and will be eligible for rewards and recognition in the process.

Wings of Hope commitment to children in their care is long-lasting and comprehensive. They provide them with 7 to 10 years of free education and support, and aim not just to instill knowledge and teach skills, but also to build character and develop personalities.

The award gives students the flexibility to be as innovative and creative as they want. Wings of Hope understand the constraints of the student timetable, and so made it that WOHAA fulfills the service element of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award, fits the CAS requirements of the International Baccalaureate (IB), whilst taking into consideration the time pressures of coursework and exams.
